Dear Church Family and Friends,

I once heard someone say, "Behind every hello there is a good-bye." Eighteen months ago First Church said hello to Kristi Spencer when she took on the newly created position of Director of Communications. Kristi came in with a wealth of experience and expertise and took this church's communications to a whole new level. And now, while it is bittersweet, we will be saying 'goodbye' to Kristi as she has accepted a full time position at Duke Divinity School beginning October 1. Kristi's husband, Ken, a united Methodist pastor serving Asbury UMC in Lincolnton, has also accepted a position with Duke Divinity School that begin January 1. We are thrilled for both Kristi and Ken as they begin this new season of ministry!

Kristi did a phenomenal job launching our new website. She consistently produced quality weekly bulletins, E-newsletters, monthly church newsletters, and created communications for special events such as VBS, Stewardship Campaigns, Pre-school and Kids for Christ. Kristi also partnered with Ann Cook to cover the office this Summer during a critical time of transition at First Church. Kristi has graciously agreed to continue serving First Church until a new Communications Director is hired. Her responsibilities will be scaled back with her main focus being on the worship bulletins and weekly E-news. Monthly newsletters will only contain key information that is not included in the weekly communication pieces.

During this time of transition, I am reminded that churches are like families - always evolving and changing. The two changes we are facing now are the search for a Praise Team Director and Communications Director. Both job ads are included in this newsletter on page 4. 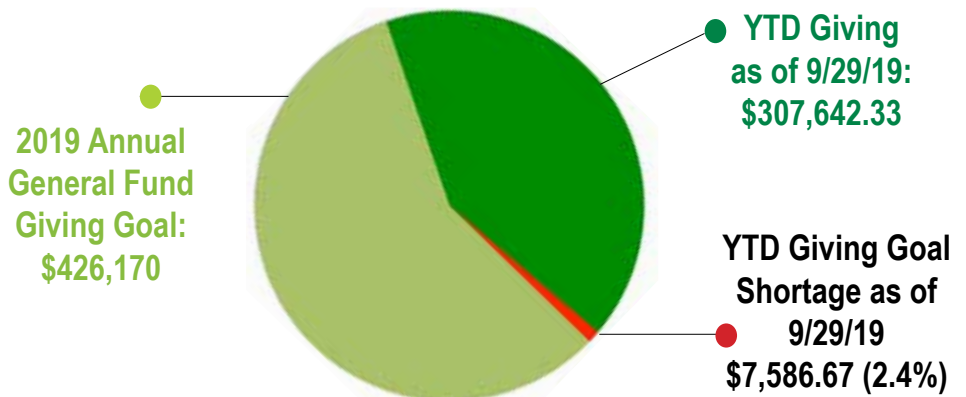


INVITATION TO ECCCM 50TH CELEBRATION
