Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,

"Who, being in very nature God,

did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;

rather, he made himself nothing

by taking the very nature of a servant,

being made in human likeness.

And being found in appearance as a man,

he humbled himself

by becoming obedient to death—

even death on a cross!

Therefore God exalted him to the highest place

and gave him the name that is above every name,

that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow,

and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord,

to the glory of God the Father."

As we head into the holiest of times in the Church year, this scripture from Philippians 2 that is often referred to as the Christ Hymn reminds us perfectly what this season is all about. It is a reminder that God loves us so much that God was willing to not just endure but also embrace the fragileness and brokenness of the world and turn it upside down so that life and love might again be the victor! This is my hope and prayer for us at First UMC Newton – that we live into this promise and hope in our own flesh or, to use a Christmastime word, incarnate the life, death, and resurrection of Christ in our own living.

We must also acknowledge that what should be a joyful, boisterous, and communal existence is tempered by the current reality. What we are experiencing is not normal; it is abnormal. It is important to claim this reality and name it for what it is and the power it exerts on us. By naming it, we take the power back. So when abnormal is the new normal, what do we do? Quite simply, we do the best we can with what we are given, all the while giving thanks to our Father in heaven.

So, that is what we will do over this holy season and beyond until we can meet together again. We will worship online virtually. We will communicate via Facebook, email, Zoom, and phone. We will take care of one another by staying healthy and reaching out from a distance. My campus minister from college sent a text of a sign that reads, "And then the whole world walked inside and shut their doors and said, 'We will stop it all. Everything. To protect our weaker ones, our sicker ones, our older ones. And nothing, nothing in the history of humankind ever felt more like love than this." Well said. But in order for it to be made real, we must do exactly that.

To that end, the church office will be officially closed until April 30. Church staff will be working remotely. All church activities and communication will be done digitally from a distance. We will still have worship on Sunday mornings at 10:30 via Facebook Live and we are working to make it more accessible to folks who are not on Facebook. Continue to check your email and snail mail. If the church office does not have your current email address or you are not on the email list, please email your current contact info to Gina at **communications@firstnewton.org**. We will also begin virtual Sunday School for classes and other small groups like the choir and UMW. The hospitality group is working to set up a telephone call schedule to check in on folks.

You have been extremely faithful in your financial giving during this time and we ask that you continue to do so to the best of your ability and situation. The church is ready to help.

Again, while we will celebrate Easter on the date, our first service back...whenever that may be...will be Easter with all the trimmings! We will get through this time and God is with us. I close with the words of a hymn that is a favorite of my mom's, an oldie but a goodie. I think it captures where we are perfectly.

Holy Week Devotions

- simple action/activity
 Wave the item around and shout "Hosanna!" If possible, walk down the street as you do this.
- scripture story: Matthew 21:1-11
- reflection questions
 - o How do you think the people felt when Jesus was walking through Jerusalem?
 - o Hosanna means "God save us." What do you hope God can save us from?

Maundy Thursday

- item(s) to gather
 a simple meal; a bowl of water, towels
- simple action/activity
 Eat a meal together as a family.
- scripture story: John 13:1-17
- simple action/activity
 Wash each other's feet (or hands).
- reflection questions
 - o What was that experience like?
 - What do you imagine it was like for the disciples to have Jesus wash their feet?

Good Friday

- item(s) to gather something heavy that you can carry
- simple action/activity
 Carry something heavy on a short walk.
- scripture story: John 19:1-37
 Light a candle. Read the scripture story. Blow out the candle.
- simple action/activity
 Sit in silence for five minutes. (adapt time frame as needed)
- reflection questions
 - o What images come to mind when hearing this story?
 - o How do you imagine Jesus' disciples felt as this happened?

Holy Saturday

- item(s) to gather: none
- simple action/activity
 Sit outside, weather permitting. If you can't sit outside, sit in your favorite room of the house. Simply sit still. Try five minutes. Maybe twenty minutes. Maybe an
- scripture story: John 19: 38-42
- reflection questions

hour. Sit in silence.

- o What do you notice? What do you hear? What do you see?
- What do you imagine Jesus' disciples were thinking/feeling?

Closing Prayer:

God, thank you for being here with us.


Comfort us in this time of abnormalcy.
